As an Ava customer, PG&E credits you the amount they would have charged you to generate your electricity. If you receive a discount on your electricity bill through the CARE, FERA or Medical ...

Every month PG&E issues a Generation Credit which appears on the "Details of PG&E Electric Delivery Charges" page, usually page 3 of your bill. That credit represents what PG&E would have charged ...

Check the rate on your community energy provider and compare with PG&E's. Look for the electric generation credit on your bill. If it's higher than the 3rd electric amount, do nothing. If 3rd party ...
